


Frank Herbert DUNE

[SIGNED] Philadelphia: Chilton Books, 1965. First Edition, First Printing. Frank Herbert spent five years researching, writing, and revising *Dune*. It appeared first as a three-part serial (*Dune World*) in *Analog* (Dec. 1963 - Feb 1964). A year later, a five-part serial (*The Prophet of Dune*) appeared in the January-May 1965 issues. These serials were expanded, reworked, and submitted to more than twenty publishers, each of whom rejected it, before being accepted and published in August 1965 by Chilton Books, a printing house better known for publishing auto repair manuals. *Dune* tied with Roger Zelazny's *This Immortal* for the Hugo Award in 1966 and it won the inaugural Nebula Award for Best Novel. Herbert dedicated his work "to the dry-land ecologists, wherever they may be, in whatever time they work, this effort at prediction is dedicated in humility and admiration." Dionysius of Halicarnassus ANTIQUITATUM SIVE ORIGINUM ROMANARUM LIBRI X [ROMAN ANTIQUITIES, BOOKS ONE to TEN] SIGUSMUNDO GELENIO INTERPRETE

Basilaea: Froben, 1549. Quarto, 518 pages. Dionysius of Halicarnassus (c. 60 BC – after 7 BC) was a Greek historian and teacher during the reign of Caesar Augustus. *Roman Antiquities* was his major work, covering the history of Rome from the mythical period to the beginning of the First Punic War. It was divided into twenty books, of which the first nine remain entire, the tenth and eleventh are nearly complete, while the remaining books exist in fragments. Dionysius of Halicarnassus wrote to reconcile Greeks to the rule of Rome by expounding upon the good qualities of their conquerors and arguing, using ancient sources, that the Romans were genuine descendants of the early Greeks. He carefully consulted the best authorities, and his work and that of Livy are the only connected and detailed extant accounts of early Roman history. Sigismund Gelenius (1497-1554) also known as Sigismund Gelen or Sigmund Gelen, was born into a family of Bohemian nobles in Prague. He was an eminent Greek scholar and humanist. *View full description of book's condition and additional photos on our website*.





















Thurman W. Arnold THE FOLKLORE OF CAPITALISM

New Haven, CT: Yale University Press, 1937. First Edition. Concerns the manner in which our system actually works rather than the moral principles that are claimed for it. With this as a basis for analysis, the author exposes the virtues and absurdities, the basic facts and inconsistent gospels of American capitalism. In the Preface, he states "By the folklore of capitalism I mean those ideas about social organizations which are not regarded as folklore but accepted as fundamental principles of law and economics." The book, which satirizes many beliefs of American laissez-faire society, was a best-seller and brought the author national attention. Arnold was the New Deal's chief trust buster and one of Washington's most eminent lawyers. In 1943, he was appointed to the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia. He later established the prestigious law firm of Arnold, Fortas and Porter, which was reorganized in 1965. Hardcover with dust jacket, 400 pages.

Thomas Phillip "Tip" O'Neill Jr. (December 9, 1912 - January 5, 1994) was an American politician who served as the 47th Speaker of the United States House of Representatives from 1977 to 1987, representing northern Boston, Massachusetts as a Democrat from 1953 to 1987. The only Speaker to serve five complete consecutive Congresses, he is the third longest-serving Speaker in American history after Sam Rayburn and Henry Clay. Inscribed by Tip O'Neill. Robert A. Heinlein REVOLT IN 2100

Chicago: Shasta Publishers, 1953. First Edition, First Printing. Collection of stories originally published in various magazines and part of the author's "Future History" series. Includes *If This Goes On* (1940), *Coventry* (1940), *Misfit* (1939), a Future History chart and an afterword *Concerning Stories Never Written*. The short novel *If This Goes On* describes a rebellion against an American theocracy and served as a vehicle for Heinlein to criticize the authoritarian potential of Christian fundamentalism. The work is not an attack on religion in general, however, as a Mormon community takes part in the anti-theocratic revolt. The short stories *Coventry* and *Misfit* describe the succeeding secular liberal society from the point of view of characters who reject it. Hardcover with dust jacket. 317 pages.
