- I. The French Monarchy and the *Ancien Regime*
- a. *Arrest du Conseil d'Etat du Roy & Arret de la Cour de Parlement*:
Twenty-Six *Arretes* (orders) issued by the Parisian Parlemant or the King (1719-1779). Quarto-sized folded pamphlets, ranging from three to six pages in length. On topics ranging from taxation to medical practice.
- b. 13 *Declarations du Roi* (1711-1788). Concerning a variety of matters, ranging from fiscal to religious policy. Twelve of the thirteen documents have an ink emendation at the top of the front page in a 19th-century hand. All in good or better condition. Ranging from 4 to 12 pages in length.

Perhaps the only national budgetary document to become a bestseller, the publication of Necker's *Compte Rendu* in February of 1781 was at once a radical act of bureaucratic transparency and a

catalyst for many of the fiscal policy disputes that defined the remaining years of the monarchy.

g. Turgot: Manuscripts, Documents, and Ephemera

i. Manuscripts

1. Autograph Promissory Note, Signed by Turgot. One page, dated September 30, 1775. States that a Monsieur Duvergier."shall pay the sum of one hundred pounds in livres, and certifies this promise to return the said amount." This may well be the Duvergier (son Vergennes) who, less than one year later, would be involved with Beaumarchais' clandestine funneling of funds to the American Revolutionaries.
2. Autograph letter, unsigned, from Turgot to Monsieur Caillard. Dated October 27, 1772. Two pages, with intact address leaf. Caillard, a Secretary to Comte de Boisgelin, a Minister of France to Parma, was at this time residing in Turgot's Paris residence on the Rue de la Chaise.
3. ALS from Turgot to a Monsieur Deflesselle. Dated March 14, 1775. 3 page autograph letter. Turgot writes from Versailles to Deflesselle (a local administrator) in Paris regarding new research on cattle disease, then ravaging the French countryside. Deflesselle is identified, in an accompanying early 20th-century catalogue entry, as one of the first *victims de la Revolution*.

This includes a 48 page report dated June 10, 1762, wherein Turgot lays out his goals for reforming the tax system in his district. “It has now been determined, Sir, to substitute in our province the system of the “Tariffed” *taille* for that of the “Arbitrary” *taille* which was previously in use; the object has been to fix in a fairer way the distribution of taxation among the taxpayers, to secure each individual against animosities, the protections, the whims and all the leaks of the Arbitrary, to finally remove the obstacle which must naturally bring to the progress of Industry and Culture the fear of not being able to improve one's well-being without exposing oneself to a further increase in Impositions.”
- b. Ten other reports, written by Turgot, and many signed by *Commissaire de Tailles a Limoges* Monsieur Thomas [Thoumas].

Ostensibly written by Raynal in late 1790 as he became disillusioned by the prospect of increasing revolutionary violence, this letter was read before the Assembly in May of 1791. It was nearly universally regarded as being imprudently timed, and Raynal spent the next five years “in retirement”. It has been determined that the letter is largely the work of the Comte de Guibert.

It was adopted by the National Assembly on September 3, 1781, and later (reluctantly) accepted by Louis XVI on September 14. This edition was printed after the King's acceptance, and features the 1789 version of *Declaration des Drots de l'Homme du Citoyen* as the preamble.

An early edition of the *Constitution de l'an III*, or the Constitution of 1795. This Constituion replaced the Constitution of 1791 (the radically democratic Constitution of 1793 was never implemented) and established the Executive Directory. It was adopted by the Convention in August, and approved by the plebiscite the next month. It remained in effect until the coup of 1799. Like the earlier Constitution, it has for its preamble the Declaration of the Rights and Duties of Man and of the Citizen, but the later version.
